PRIESTHOOD IS THE SACRAMENT OF ______IN HIS CHURCH.

"God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son..." Hebrews 1:1-2

[Priesthood] is the sacrament of Christ's presence in the Church. It is the mystery of the presence of the head and bridegroom with his body and his bride in all the fullness of his messianic presence and power, with all the fullness of grace and truth of the eternal life of the kingdom of God which he brings. Jesus Christ is present in the Church as its head and husband, king and lord, priest and pastor, prophet and teacher, reconciler and healer. The realization and manifestation of his presence is the sacrament of the ordained clergy which is an essential element of the one "great mystery... Christ and the Church" (Ephesians 5:32)." Fr. Thomas Hopko

"And no man takes this honor [priesthood] to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was." Hebrews 5:4

"It is the sacrament of Christ's abiding presence in the Church as its husband and head, priest and pastor, prophet and teacher, master and lord, forgiver, reconciler, healer. It is the mystery within the great mystery of Christ and the Church which guarantees the objective presence of salvation in the body, for it guarantees the objective presence of the Savior in all the fullness and power of his theandric (divine/human), messianic activity." PART 3: BAPTISM

OUTCOME #1: REGENERATION

"the process of being reborn (born again) or recreated (made new)

Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. "You see how many are the benefits of baptism, and some think its heavenly grace consists only in the remission of sins, but... it does not simply take away our sins, nor simply cleanse us from our faults, but so as if we were born again. For it creates and fashions us anew not forming us again out of earth, but creating us out of another element, namely, of the nature of water. For it does not simply wipe the vessel clean, but entirely remolds it again. For that which is wiped clean, even if it be cleaned with care, has traces of its former condition, and bears the remains of its defilement, but that which falls into the new mold, and is renewed by means of the flames, laying aside all uncleanness, comes forth from the furnace, and sends forth the same brilliancy with things newly formed." THE DEVELOPMENT OF CONFESSION

1ST CENTURY: Persecuted Church (no need for confession)

2ND CENTURY: People born into Christianity (public penance)

1. WHAT HAPPENS IN THE EUCHARIST?

"I believe, I believe and confess to the last breath; that this is the Lifegiving Body that Your Only-Begotten Son, our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ took from our lady, the lady of us all, the holy Theotokos, St. Mary. He made It One with His divinity without mingling, without confusion, and without alteration." Liturgy of St. Basil

"The Holy Eucharist is the repetition of the Last Supper. It is also the self-same sacrifice of the cross, repeated mystically. This does not mean that it is "done all over again" but rather, "once again made actual and present to those of us living today. The Divine Liturgy is not a reenactment of the Eucharistic Mystery, but a timeless, eternal recapitulation (recreation) and mystical participation in the Divine Kingdom." Ambrose of Milan
